

Year Four: Theology, Ethics, and Interfaith Encounter

Participants in the EfM program study the entire sweep of the Christian tradition from the earliest period to the present. The seminar group is the nucleus of the Education for Ministry program. A group consists of six to twelve participants and a trained mentor who meet weekly over the course of a nine-month academic year. These meetings are usually from two and a half to three hours in length.

Georgine's White Chicken Chili

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed

2 (15 oz.) cans white beans (navy, cannellini, great northern, etc.)

1 (4 oz.) can green chilis, drained and chopped

3 cups low-sodium chicken broth

1 white onion, chopped

1 teaspoon garlic powder

1 teaspoon chili powder

1 teaspoon ground cumin

salt and pepper, to taste

sour cream or plain, Greek yogurt, garnish



Directions

Season cubed chicken with salt and pepper, and place in Dutch oven.

Add chicken broth and beans, then the chopped onion and green chilies.

Season with garlic and chili powder, cumin, salt and pepper.

Cook in a large pot or Dutch oven on the stove over medium heat for 1 hour, stirring occasionally.

Make sure chicken is cooked through and serve hot, garnished with sour cream or yogurt.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We want to draw your attention to one of the most exciting Diocesan projects which we're calling The Year of Resilience.

The Year of Resilience will run from Easter 2015 through Lent 2016.

The excitement of the Year of Resilience is to help every congregation in the Diocese develop a Resilience & Preparedness Plan appropriate for your congregation and ministries to provide a safe and resilient environment for our people and those we serve.

We have a variety of resources to help you engage with this project. This is an opportunity for lay leadership, for outreach and for developing stronger relationships with other churches in your area.

Developing a Resilience Plan begins with convening a small group – perhaps no more than two or three people – to do the work. You can delegate this to your Vestry or to someone in the congregation willing to take it on.

We are planning a webinar in April to introduce the planning process and provide resources for getting started that will be offered four different times: twice on April 15 and twice on April 22. Ideally, one of these webinars should be attended by whoever is going to lead your planning effort. Please have all those interested sign up online at http://www.dioco.org/year-of-resilience-webinar.html

Developing a Resilience and Preparedness Plan has important benefits:

- You will be better prepared to protect the physical and information resources of your congregation in the event of future disasters or emergencies;
- You will be prepared to care for the people of your congregation more effectively; and
- You have the opportunity to develop a plan for reaching out to the larger community in the event of future disasters or large-scale emergencies.

Please begin planning to include the Resilience Plan in your work for the coming months, and have the leader of your planning team sign up for one of the April webinars.


