Laetere Sunday

Laetare Sunday (pron.: /liːˈtɛərɪ/ or /lai'tari/ as in ecclesiastical Latin),[1] so called from the *incipit* of the Introit at Mass. "Laetare Jerusalem" ("O be joyful, Jerusalem"), (from Isaiah 66:10, masoretic text) is a name often used to denote the fourth Sunday of the season of Lent in the Christian liturgical calendar. This Sunday is also known as Mothering Sunday, Refreshment Sunday, Mid-Lent Sunday (in French mi-carême), and Rose Sunday (because the golden rose sent by the

popes to Catholic sovereigns used to be blessed at this time). The term "Laetare Sunday" is used predominantly, though not exclusively, by Roman Catholics and Anglicans. The word translates from the Latin *lae*tare, singular imperative of laetari to rejoice.

The full Introit reads: Laetare Jerusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam: gaudete cum laetitia, qui in tristitia fuistis: ut exsultetis,et satiemini ab uberibus consolationis vestrae. Psalm Laetatus sum in his quae dicta sunt mihi: in domum Domini ibimus

Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her: rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow: that you may exult, and be filled from the breasts of your consolation

Laetere Sunday, continued

Laetare Sunday can fall on any date between March 1 and April 4. Psalm: I rejoiced when they said to me: "we shall go to God's House!

This Sunday was also once known as "the Sunday of the Five Loaves," from the traditional Gospel reading for the day. Prior to the adoption of the modern "common" lectionaries, the Gospel reading for this Sunday in the Lutheran, Anglican, Roman Catholic, Western-rite Orthodox, and Old Catholic churches was the story of the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

In the Roman Catholic, Anglican, and some Protestant traditions, there may be flowers on the high altar, the organ may be played as a solo instrument, and priests are given the option to wear rose-coloured vestments at Mass held on this day, in place of the violet vestments normally worn during Lent. The day is a day of relaxation from normal lenten rigors; a day of hope with Easter being at last within sight. Traditionally, even weddings (otherwise banned during Lent) could be performed on this day.

Laetare Sunday is the popular name for the Fourth Sunday in Lent. *Laetare* means "Rejoice" in Latin, and the Introit (entrance antiphon) in both the Traditional Latin Mass and the Novus Ordo is Isaiah 66:10-11, which begins "*Laetare*, *Jerusalem*" ("Rejoice, O Jerusalem").

Because the midpoint of Lent is the Thursday of the third week of Lent, Laetare Sunday has traditionally been viewed as a day of celebration, on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened. The passage from Isaiah continues, "rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow," and on Laetare Sunday, the purple vestments and altar cloths of Lent are set aside, and rose ones are used instead. Flowers, which are normally forbidden during Lent, may be placed on the altar. Traditionally, the organ was never played during Lent, except on Laetare Sunday.

Laetare Sunday is also known as Rose Sunday or Refreshment Sunday, and it has a counterpart in Advent: Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, when purple vestments are exchanged for rose ones. The point of both days is to provide us encouragement as we progress toward the end of each respective penitential season.





Mary Hatfield's Corned Beef and Cabbage Soup

1 medium onion 3 stalks celery

3 medium carrots 3 TBLS unsalted butter

1/4 t allspice 1 can petite diced tomatoes

3 cups low sodium beef broth 4 cups chopped green cabbage

1/4 lb. red potatoes 3/4 c quick cooking barley

1/4 lb. cooked shredded corned beef Kosher salt and fresh ground pepper

Pulse onion, celery and carrots in processor or chop until pea-sized. Melt butter. Add onion, celery, carrots and allspice. Sauté about 5 min. til soft.

> Add tomatoes, beef broth, cabbage, potatoes and barley. Add 4 cups of water. Bring to a boil, uncover and simmer til barley and potatoes are tender.

> Salt and pepper to taste. Serves 6.



Taize: A Pilgrimage of Trust on Earth

A Message from the Diocese:

I'm excited to share with you a unique opportunity for young adults, age 18-35 to participate in a wonderful spiritual retreat. The Lakota people of Pine Ridge, South Dakota, are welcoming the brothers of Taize, France in hosting "Taize: A Pilgrimage of Trust on Earth" on May 24-27, 2013. The outdoor gathering will include meditative prayer together three times a day, Bible study, workshops, small group sharing, and meals together, provided by the local Lakota people. The event is meant for young people aged 18-35, a voice rarely heard in the church or in society. Young adults, mentors, and clergy from the Diocese of Colorado have coordinated efforts to provide an opportunity for any young adult, within the Episcopal Church and beyond, to attend this gathering as part of a larger community.

Individuals can register to attend on their own, and individual groups can do so as well. However, our hope is that both individuals and groups would choose to be part of our diocesan contingency in order to foster community among each other that we may grow and develop after the event. Plus, we take care of the logistics!

The registration deadline is April 1, 2013, though we encourage early registration, as the event is predicted to fill up. 
