# Food stamps will be reduced for all recipients at the end of October!

Food stamps were increased by Congress in 2009 in recognition of the

crashing economy and resulting new unemployment, but with a sunset date of October, 2013. That date is upon us now, but the recovery has not lifted folks who rely on this safety net. Poverty is up, and employment opportunities have not filled the gap created since 2008. Further, a bill now in Congress aims to reduce eligibility for food stamps to 3 months for able-bodied single people who are not working, volunteering, or training.

EChO has been addressing these problems for over a year now. New food distribution programs have been implemented which target children in poverty. Employment training and job listings have helped many of our able-bodied clients to look for and find jobs in our area. We've intensively worked with our longest term clients to help them toward self sufficiency, moving two thirds of these folks off our rolls. Sadly, these initiatives are not enough to stem the tide of unemployed or underemployed citizens in the foothills.

The number of families served in 2013 has not decreased as we'd hoped and worked for. The only resource these families can rely on when government cuts back is EChO! Can you help us continue to cover the food insecurity shortfall that exists today, and to expand our food resources to make up some of the slack created by cuts to the food stamp program later this year?



### Pasta Fagioli Soup

### Ingredients

- 12 ounces Santa Fe chicken sausage, halved lengthwise and sliced (such as Amy's)
- 3 cups fat-free, less-sodium chicken broth
- 1/2 cup uncooked small seashell pasta
- 2 cups coarsely chopped zucchini (about 2 small zucchini)
- 1 (14.5-ounce) can stewed tomatoes, undrained
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 (15-ounce) can kidney beans, rinsed and drained
- 1/3 cup (about 1 1/2 ounces) shredded Asiago cheese

Heat a large saucepan over high heat. Add sausage; cook 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Add broth and pasta; bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat, and simmer 4 minutes. Add zucchini and tomatoes; bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat, and simmer 2 minutes. Stir in basil, oregano, and beans; cover and simmer for 3 minutes or until pasta and zucchini are tender. Sprinkle with cheese.

REMEMBER—MULTIPLY BY 8 for EChO RECIPE!!!




