A Message from the Rector

Lent - a time for a spiritual checkup. That's what Lent is about - a spiritual shape-up plan for one's Christian life.

Bishop Mark Lawrence says, "Repentance, once you commit yourself to it, usually ends in joy." He states, "I suspect that if each of us went to a doctor specializing in spiritual life, as one goes to a physician for an annual physical checkup, the subsequent prescription for our maladies would be quite different. A doctor of the soul might prescribe exercise, getting enough sleep, keeping the Sabbath, reading, seeing a movie or even learning to laugh again."

A formative influence and spiritual master of the 20th century was Fr. Hugh Maycock. One of his former students, Kenneth Leech, recounted that Fr. Maycock concentrated on two unusual disciplines: The value of sleep and laughter.

Sleep and prayer are closely related. Both call for slowing down, a relaxing and "an abandonment to trust." Many of us live in a permanent state of semi-exhaustion. To embrace a discipline of proper sleep would be spiritually helpful by calming and soothing us. Being refreshed makes us ready for prayer.

Then there is the importance of laughter. Leech writes, "Laughter is necessary to our sanity: a person with no humor is like an iron bridge with no give in it. It is vital that we learn to laugh at ourselves." Laughter has been shown to have therapeutic qualities for the mind and body. It also has value for our life with the Lord.

So, how does one go about choosing a Lenten discipline? I'm not talking about giving up chocolate or coffee or some other less challenging undertaking. Rather, make time for sleep and laughter so that you are re-energized when praying.

Prayerfully listen to God. Don't be surprised by what you may hear. It may be a delightful prescription, such as "slow down," or "sleep more," or "laugh a lot more!" Of course, some of us need to hear, "get the lead out," or "quit nursing your wounds," or "forgive and get on with your life."

May a blessed Lent come your way.


