### A Message from the Rector

Try googling this question, "What do Episcopalians believe about Easter?" Once you get beyond the netfind.com, bing.com and Amazon.com ads, you'll find that there are several Episcopal churches with "Welcome" pages. I found the home page of St. Dunston in Madison, Wisconsin helpful on the first part of the question, "What do Episcopalians believe?"

"In March 2014 Kyle Oliver, of the <u>Center for the Ministry of Teaching at the Virginia Theological Seminary</u>, wrote his brief 'elevator pitch' for, and about, the Episcopal Church. 'The Episcopal Church is a faith community for grown-ups. That doesn't mean we exclude children or that we don't sometimes act like them. It does mean we are comfortable with mess and skeptical of easy answers. We worship a God whose will is sometimes hard to know, but whose love knows no bounds."

"We are not the one true church, not the biggest, hippest or best organized. We're a ragtag bunch united primarily by our firm conviction that praying together forms us into the people God is calling us to be."

"What do we believe about Jesus? It's a bit more complicated than we have time for in an elevator. Basically: (1) We believe that being born into the world was the way God continued reaching out to us in love. (2) We believe that living, loving, seeking and serving as Jesus did leads us more deeply into abundant life. Not easy. Abundant."

So, lets go back to the entire question, "What do Episcopalians believe about Easter?"

We believe that after Jesus "suffered death and was buried" that "on the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures...." Book of Common Prayer, p. 358 (Nicene Creed). Jesus rising on the third day is the most important part of our belief as Episcopalian Christians! Yet it may be the hardest part to believe about Jesus.


As Kyle Oliver wrote, we are a "faith community" following Jesus "whose will is sometimes hard to know, but whose love knows no bounds." I will add, Jesus showed us love when he accepted his Father's will and was obedient (giving ear to) even to death on the cross. That's obedience; that's love.

Our belief in the resurrection of Jesus is strengthened by the fact that we are "giving ear to" (obedience) to Him today.



### **Douglas Hall Update**

Douglas Hall is in need of refurbishing and ideas have been discussed over the years. In 2017, a building inspection was performed, however, any modifications or even a defined plan remains undone. Fortunately, Liz Hallas an architect who is also a member of the church, has generously provided 'as built' drawings created at her architectural firm. With the expertise Liz provides concerning code requirements, and the deficiencies identified by the inspection, we now have an informed starting point.

The Property Committee will request parishioner input so a plan can be developed in 2018. Thereafter, work can begin, be it only necessary maintenance or the first part of a larger project that will require completion in phases.

Liz indicated that if the building is upgraded, making it available for outside groups, the existing bathroom must be updated to include two handicapped accessible bathrooms. The space required and cost of the bathrooms should be factored into any design beyond cosmetic repairs and the current limitations of building use.

The issues to be decided upon with parishioner input are these:

1. The investment in Douglas Hall being done for the benefit of the congregation – summer services, small groups and other church—related uses. With little or no increased revenue from these uses, construction costs would be paid for by the church.

2. The building is reconfigured or upgraded to be used for weddings, conferences, organized groups or other non-church related activities. This could increase the revenue generated by the building and help defray what would likely be a larger construction cost.

The church family would benefit from either approach and we need to come to a consensus on what that will be. We would like to have something done this calendar year, but it must be done correctly, per code and not preclude another future use or direction so it is wasted time and investment.

Some ideas are:

- 1.Refurbish the existing space by correcting deficiencies (electrical box, wiring, etc.). Removing the drop ceiling and abandoned wiring above the ceiling to increase ceiling height, install new flooring, etc.
- 2. Add space on the SE end of the building to accommodate the new bathrooms (and possibly kitchen) to make the meeting space larger and allow major plumbing/electrical be done in new construction.
- 3. The building began life as the second story of the old fire house. Lift the existing structure and place it on a newly constructed first floor.
- 4. Most likely several other ideas...

To make a plan in 2018 and move forward, we need more hard numbers, but we also need interested input to determine if a plan is worth pursuing.



### COT HAS LOST A DEAR FRIEND

We mourn the death of one who contributed much to the Church of the Transfiguration. On March 4, 2018 Barbara Glover MacMillan died peacefully in Denton, Texas. She was 89 years old.

From the 1980's until 2002, Barbara and her late husband, The Rev. Bill MacMillan lived at St. Raphael's Retreat House, directing numerous retreats. They offered "Rest, Refreshment, Recreation and Renewal" to people from all walks of life.

Barbara earned a Masters degree in Music Therapy and as a skilled musician, was the CoT organist, directed the Choirs and taught many in the community to play the piano. She was a Daughter of the King and worked tirelessly for the church and retreat house.

Barbara is survived by her children, Barton, Mark, Jacqui, Joel, Kier and Ann, their spouses and eight grandchildren. She will be remembered for her passion in spreading Christ's message of love.

### **COT ARCHIVE PROJECT**




