A Message from the Rector

During the recent clergy retreat I was sitting next to a priest and she kept checking her cell phone. Ok, I'm not saying that I don't do the same thing. It can be embarrassing when we are so totally immersed in our phone that we aren't even aware of what is happening around us. It's bad enough when someone brings it to our attention-but even worse when its the person to whom we should be listening As much as we want to be "connected", we know that sometimes it is necessary to "disconnect."

I always feel better when I take some time away from all my technological devices to just be still and be with God. Jesus invites us to "abide in me as I abide in you." He asks each of us to simply be with him. This sounds deceptively easy.

Try listening to opening the words of the Collect for Purity: "Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid." It's okay to relax and stop worrying about things that are beyond our control. We can abide with God now and do all those other things later. The promise of Jesus is abundant life here and now, not just in the future. That is what abiding in the power of the Word is all about.

Franciscan priest and author, Richard Rohr speaks about "getting on the train" with God or joining in the "force field" of God. Both are good analogies of "abiding" with God. So, listen to Jesus' beautiful invitation: "Abide in me as I abide in you."


Take the time to get on the "A train" (the Abiding Train)!



The History Corner

This is a picture of the old Bancroft Ranch taken from what is now Lariat Lodge. Obviously, this was long before our present church was constructed in 1963.

The main house is now known as Bancroft Hall and currently houses the EChO Food Pantry.

In the early 1900's, the ranch house and out-buildings were purchased by the Evergreen Conference and for much of the last century the area was known as the "lower" campus.



Notice the barn to the left of the main house. It became the men's dormitory for the Conference and is now used for storage.
