A Message from the Rector

At a recent Bible Study, we had a thought-provoking discussion. The topic was whether or not one should give money to the homeless. Some said they would give money. Others thought the homeless were taking advantage of their situation soliciting. They felt that if given money, the beggar would use it for drugs or alcohol.

In Florida, especially during the winter months when the homeless make their way south for the warm weather, there is usually someone on a corner asking for money, i.e. pan-handling.

My years of working with the poor and homeless led me to realize that these people are survivors. I got to know many men and women, young and old, regulars and transients who lived on the streets. Some are the "working poor" with part-time jobs mowing lawns, raking, sweeping or performing other manual labor. A few individuals spun signs for stores on the main roads, earning \$40 per day.

I remember a 40 year-old man telling me that by begging he was able to make up to \$100 cash per day. He stopped pan-handling because he felt that he was taking advantage of the emotions of others. Instead, although he earned less money, he spun a sign for eight hours a day.

At the heart of the matter, Jesus said, "When you offer food, drink or shelter to the least of these, you do it for me." Matthew 25. In other words, it is your intention of kindness that elevates your actions. If your heart says to give, then give.

It took time, but eventually I earned their trust. I was told that one of the worst things about being homeless was that they felt "invisible." People would often walk or drive by, ignoring or simply "looking through" them. The homeless just wanted to be acknowledged and treated as humans.

I presented a challenge to the Bible Study group: Don't ignore the homeless. Greet them. Wish them a good morning. Ask their name. Engage them in conversation. You will discover that, believe it or not, just like you, they've lead interesting lives. You will find that these individuals have the same hopes and dreams as everyone else. They may not have lots of material things, but like you, they have their pride.

Being a Christian means treating others as we'd like to be treated. We must walk the walk, and talk the talk.
