A Message from the Rector

Last Spring the CoT Vestry requested that a weekly Children's Chapel Service be established for the students of EDSE. The School Board agreed and the decision was made to start the Children's Chapel in September.

On Thursday, September 22, five children and two adults attended our first Service. We gathered in the Sanctuary and I asked the two, three and four year old children if they knew where we were. A tiny little girl replied, "Church." After talking it over, we all decided that instead of Church, we would call this place, "God's House." When I asked what we do in God's House, one child responded, "We pray for our daddies and mommies and brothers and sisters." Another little boy piped up, "and Nana!"

I brought up the Genesis story of God creating the world, including all the animals. I asked them to tell me about some of the animals God made. A little blond boy answered, "Blue bears!." "Blue bears?" I asked. Everyone was giggling! "Yep, blue bears an blueberries!" Smiling, one of their teachers explained that they had recently read a book about Blue Bears. Makes perfect sense to a preschooler, right?

Then I showed them a picture of the Garden of Eden with many different animals pictured. They were able to name every animal, even providing the appropriate sound effects (monkeys, lions, bears and elephants)! I challenged them by pointing to a flamingo, but sure enough, they were able to correctly name it, even telling me that it was pink! Such intelligent children!

Producing a Bible, I explained that the beginning of the book tells a story about God making the light, the land, the animals, the sea, the fish and finally making man. Did they know the name of the first man? They were stumped. Suddenly, one little guy pointed to himself and said, "Asher?" We all were laughing when I told him that although he was close, the first man's name was Adam. Did they know the name of the first woman? No takers. I told them it was Eve and that Adam and Eve were the first man and woman. To conclude the Chapel, I played my guitar and we all sang, "This Little Light of Mine" with the children raising their little index fingers along with the song.

Amazingly, I was able to keep their attention for roughly 25 minutes! I am especially thankful to Shelley Black and Mary Hatfield for joining us in the fun and wisdom of our first Children's Chapel Service. It was a special time and I'm looking forward to every Thursday at 3: 00 pm in "God's House!" Please join us!


