A Message from the Rector

Theologian and Franciscan priest, Fr. Richard Rohr compares the Gospel about a woman who is hiding ordinary yeast in the bread dough, to Jesus as a newborn, being hidden in an ordinary manger. The angel appeared to the ordinary shepherds, telling them to find the child wrapped in bands of cloth lying in a manger.

Following that pattern of thought, we are called to look for God in the ordinary. It is sometimes more difficult to find God in the ordinary than in the spectacular. We must train our senses to be open to God in the ordinary: the ordinary lady suffering in silence; the ordinary mother tending her sick child and the ordinary older gentleman having trouble walking.

While we know that God is almighty, Fr. Rohr also challenges us to look at God as all vulnerable. He says that our western culture has focused so much on the Almighty God, that we've missed a God who is all vulnerable. Certainly, Jesus was vulnerable as a baby lying in a feeding trough; its amazing that he survived! But we also see Jesus as a man, vulnerable from the wood of the manger to the wood of the cross. If we identify with Jesus, then we must realize that our lives following a vulnerable God will be vulnerable too.

We don't like to talk about our own vulnerability, but it is important for us to recognize that suffering is an ordinary part of our lives. It is a terrible thing to be alone and suffering. This is where our Christian community comes into play. We need to share our suffering as well as our joy. If we share, our community can take some of the burden from us, making our problems more bearable.

In 2017, we must train our senses to be open to the all vulnerable God and our vulnerable neighbors. We are called by Jesus to take care of the least of these. Please join me in reaching out to those within our community who are vulnerable and in need.

Hope Academy's Director, Sara Bradbury gave a moving presentation on the needs of girls trapped into child prostitution on the streets of Denver. The average life expectancy of these child prostitutes is six years. Ms. Bradbury explained the devious ways these very young girls are cajoled into this horrible life and the means by which they are forced to stay.
