



Regarding:	A Call to Action: Family Separation at Our Borders

The Office of the Bishop has received a number of inquiries regarding the practice of separating innocent children from their parents who are seeking asylum in our country. Bishop O'Neill believes that this practice is appalling, cruel, unconscionable, in no way justifiable and should be stopped.

At the 2015 General Convention, the Episcopal Church passed resolutions on immigration including one to "support expanded immigration relief for youth and parents designed to keep families together." The Office of Advocacy and Social Justice encourages all Episcopalians to show support and voice their opposition to the inhumane practice of family separation currently being enforced by our government.

Parishioners are asked to donate empty prescription bottles (with the labels removed), placing them in the basket at the church. Susie Williams boxes and mails the bottles to a distribution center where they are sent worldwide for use in dispensing medication.

Evergreen Christian Outreach was launched on the CoT property almost 30 years ago. This non-profit works with the entire Evergreen community to serve the disadvantaged. EChO assists the less fortunate with a Job Assistance Program, an Enrichment Center, a Retail Thrift Shop and their vitally important Food Pantry. One of EChO's biggest annual fundraisers, the Turkey Trot is sponsored and hosted by our church. More information about EChO may be found at info@evergreenchristianoutreach.org.

CHP works in partnership with rural Haitian communities to support their rise out of extreme poverty. Transfiguration and CHP have a 25 year relationship. Working with CHP and the community of Petit Trou, Haiti, our church has helped with the construction of the St. Paul's Church/School Campus, drilling wells, establishing a Community Health Service, setting up an Agricultural Seed Bank and much more. Through the years, CoT has been represented on the CHP Board of Directors and presently, Cathleen McManus is a member of the Board.

CoT coordinates with IRC to provide assistance for refugees from around the world. Our church has supported refugees from Afghanistan and Syria. Transfiguration is working with the Diocese of Colorado, focusing on our country's immigration crisis. Marcia Walsh is the CoT facilitator for our church in its efforts to welcome immigrants to the US.

The Emergency Shelter Program (ESP), initiated three years ago by 12 community organizations, specifically addresses the needs of the homeless. ESP provides food and a warm place to stay during cold weather nights. For one week each month, from October through April, Transfiguration is a host site for this important program.

The History Corner

The Evergreen Conference (1919 - 1990) brought students, clergy and religious music professionals from across the country to Evergreen every summer to attend the music programs and seminars. Canon Douglas played a major role in making the Conference nationally famous.


