Advent is a time of discerning God's call to us

In his essay, "The Good News of the Nativity" Thomas Merton presented Advent as a time for discerning what is most relevant for us individually and communally:

"Advent is a time for judging the choices we make in our we are living our lives.

Advent is a ritual moment for confronting discomforting truths.

Advent overturns our complacencies to realize the exceeding narrow but true way of Christian discipleship. If we receive the good news of Christmas, let us (also) accept Jesus' hard stuff."

Let us heed the warning of

Olivier Clement, who wrote in "On Human Being:"

Every one who relinquishes the security of a sleepwalking existence is sooner or later mortally wounded by the world's suffering. But because God became man and took this suffering on himself, the way of vulnerability and death becomes resurrection.

I was totally pulled in by these words this morning as I read "Bridges to Contemplative Living" with Thomas Merton. I was pulled in deeper when I read and reflected on "the security of a sleepwalking existence" because I had lead that life as a lawyer for many years. I knew there was something wrong with living a life that was so focused on work, that I felt numb inside. But there was



truly a false security in my then work-a-day world.

But following a youth mission trip which I experienced as a new adult leader, I felt something new happening in me as I awoke from this "sleepwalking existence." I really felt seriously "wounded by the world's suffering."



I felt turned inside out by the experience of God stirring up my heart in a very unexpected way. I didn't like the feeling at the time, and it took me awhile to sort it out. Indeed, God was working on me overtime! I was stubborn and trying to hold onto the security of a false life, but God used a big two-by-four to make God's point - "wake up to the true reality of God and the world's suffering around you. No longer live for yourself, but start living for others."

In a word, I was going through a personal Advent - a time of "confronting discomforting truths." God was calling meto be a disciple. Along the way, I found out that there is a lot of grief in giving up what the world touts as "the good life".

But what I was getting was the "disciplined life" with a promise of the "resurrected life."

I cannot tell you that the work is not hard, but when I follow God's call, life flows in a better way - because it is God's way!

I hope that you will accept God's invitation of doing the hard work of discerning, judging choices, and confronting discomforting truths. Hear the call of God inviting you to become a true disciple!



Christmas Cookies and Kitchen Showers

The ECW had a wonderful November meeting, hearing about the need for affordable housing in Evergreen and also about an Inclement Weather Shelter program that several churches are trying to develop for the homeless in Evergreen. We will be learning more about these in months to come.

Our next meeting will be on December 12 at 9 am **at Jan Stadler's** beautiful house, and we will bake Christmas cookies in her huge caterer's kitchen. Jan has four ovens (sigh) four stand mixers, and innumerable cookie cutters and cookie sheets. You may mix and bake your dough there -- Jan will provide flour, sugar, eggs and so forth. Or you might bring your dough already made and shape and bake it there, or you could bring already baked cookies and decorate them. Whatever you want. We will have to work out the logistics when we get there. We may need a professional choreographer to orchestrate the moves.

Jan is providing lunch afterwards so we need an idea of how many people will be there. Please e-mail me at sgadeken@aol.com to tell me if you will come. Please e-mail unless you have no access to e-mail as I am bad at checking for phone messages and sometimes I hear the names wrong.

What you do with your cookies is up to you. You may exchange with others and take them home, or donate them to the firehouse for needy children, or bring them to the church for the school's Christmas party on Thursday the 17th.

In addition to baking cookies and eating lunch, Joella has had a wonderful idea! We will have a kitchen shower for St. Raphael's kitchen, which we are all praying will be finished by Christmas. We used to do this periodically for the Transfiguration kitchen, which the ECW paid for and furnished. Please note that this is not a shower for Cathleen, whose kitchen is upstairs and fully furnished by her. The downstairs kitchen is a church kitchen and needs furnishing for church use.

The colors are celery green, pale yellow and beige. It will need small appliances like a toaster and a food chopper. Also casseroles, pot holders, dish towels, a manual can opener, tumblers. Cooking utensils, pizza cutter, shears, corkscrew, tongs. Stainless steel mixing bowls. Plastic containers of the Rubbermaid type. Wine glasses, tea towels. There are already plates and mugs, a coffee machine and cutting boards. It will need pots and pans -- lightly used is fine but please do not bring anything worn.

Anything else you think of can probably be put to good use. You can wrap them or not and we will open them during lunch. We will each unwrap our own or pass them around to unwrap. Cathleen will not do the unwrapping because we want to make it clear that this for St Raphael's and not the McManus'.

Our text is:

"And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us" John 1: 14


On Outreach Sunday, December 13, we will celebrate not only the Word but also the flesh that Jesus sanctified when he took on our human flesh and dwelt among us as one of us. In so doing, he took on as well the less attractive aspects of that flesh, the things we do not talk about. When Jesus took on our flesh, he also took on our messiness as well.

And how do we cope with this messiness? Among other things, with clean underwear. No one donates his or her underwear to clothing drives, and it wouldn't be accepted if one did. But what, then, do the poor do for clean underwear, an absolute necessity for living decently? As Jeni Warnken says when teaching her Emergency Survival classes: "Don't forget to pack clean underwear. The whole world looks better when you are wearing clean underwear." So the Outreach Committee is declaring the second Sunday in December to be Undie Sunday, and we ask each member of the congregation to bring an unopened package of underwear, men's, women' or children's, to church that Sunday, and we will take them to EChO. We need a variety of sizes with an emphasis on the larger, so if you bring two packages bring one large or extra-large and one small or medium. Long underwear would be wonderful, of course, but plain cotton underpants and T-shirts are just fine. In giving these necessities to EChO's clients, we celebrate our essential oneness with all God's children, rich and poor, for, after all, whether we are dressed richly or in rags, underneath it we all need our underwear.

Mix till yeast dissolves

1 cup warm water

1 Tb. Yeast

, 3 Tb. Honey

1/3 cup flour

Let rest until the Yeast starts to

, bubble.

Add:

1 1/2 Tb. Oil

1/2 teas. Salt


2 1/3 cup of flour

Knead for five minutes. Turn back into bowl, cover, and let rise until doubled about one hour. Punch down, roll to 1/4 " thick. Cut into one 3" round and five 4" rounds. Place on un greased cookie sheet. Let rise for 10-15 minutes. Cut a cross on each.

Bake at 350 for 10-12 minutes (Whole wheat flour)



Prayer Shawl Ministry



Cold months sitting in front of a warm fire, watching football, knitting needles (or crochet hook) in hand is the vision of an avid Prayer Shawl participant. Hopefully the Broncos will play well and Luckily with Homespun yarn it is textured and a simple knit pattern is all that is needed.

The Trinity Pattern consists of three knit, three purl across the whole row. The second row then does the same thing except that you want the three purls to be above the three knitted stitches. This pattern creates a lovely shawl full of prayer.

SHAWL

Cast on 66 stitches.

Row 1: (Knit 3, purl 3) until the last 3 stitches, knit 3.

Row 2: (Purl 3, knit 3) until the last 3 stitches, purl 3.

Repeat these 2 rows until piece measures about 60 in. (152.5 cm). Bind off.

He was a surgeon who needlepointed in order to keep his fingers flexible for surgery. Each kneeler depicts a different cross and a wildflower native to Evergreen.




