

Trot. It would be held the Saturday before Palm Sunday. We are seeking a chairperson and will present a Plan to the Vestry for 2016 or 2017. The other fund raising
activity will be an "Evergreen Historic Home Tour" in collaboration with the Jefferson County Historical Society. A committee is forming so volunteers are welcome.

ECW will meet next on Saturday, February 13 at 9:00 AM in the Sanctuary. The




