My Second Swan Song

On Monday May 19th I gave the Vestry my responses to a list of Exit Questions suggested by: *Fundamentals of Interim Ministry.* They suggested I share it with all of you.

What strengths did you find in our congregation when you arrived? Have these changed during your ministry?

- I found a congregation with a determination to persevere, to get through difficulty and to stay together.
- * I admired your love, care and respect for the property and its rich history and importance to the Evergreen community.
- I was in awe of your outstanding Organist/choirmaster and very talented Choir.
- * The Vestry worked so well together with a common concern for the wellbeing of the congregation.

What weaknesses did you find in our congregation? Have those changed during your ministry?

- Discouragement "Here we go again"
- Lack of enthusiasm
- Lack of ministry committees/communities
- But, I also found people hungry for authentic spiritual formation we crowded into Stuart Hall for my teachings
- Now there is enthusiasm, hope and a very clear definition of what you need in a leader.

If you could change/adapt any two to three things about the congregation, what would they be? Do you have any ideas to help in these areas?

I would find a more adequate space for Adult Education. Adult Education strengthens and feeds the people in a way that feeds into worship and greater commitment to the church.

Are there any new ministries or missions you would like to suggest?

- Stewardship Committee comprehensive
- * Outreach Committee and a line item for Outreach in the budget
- Evangelism and incorporation of new members
- * Add a greeter for the 10:15 service who simply greets people, invites them to take a name tag and to sign the visitor book, leaving the ushers free to make the coffee, hand out bulletins, direct the kids to Sunday School, show new people with children where the nursery is, etc.
- Start a Confirmation/inquirers class for a few members. Jennifer Francis for reception and Kristy
 Morrison for confirmation there may be others interested for reaffirmation.

It has been a joy, and pleasure, and blessing for me to serve you in the last year. I trust it has increased your faith in some measure. Certainly God put us together – the right person at the right time. I believe that is an affirmation from God that you are to enter into a brand new era of becoming the healthy, vital, faith community that you deserve to be.

Two cups of grapes, halved. I leave this out if I am making sandwiches rather than serving this as salad.


Dressing:


