
The Chi Rho (or Constantine's Cross) is an asigla, or a warrior's cross, and is one of the earliest cruciform symbols used by Christians. It is formed by superimposing the first two letters of the word "Christ" in Greek, chi =ch and rho = r. Although not technically a cross, the Chi Rho invokes the crucifixion of Jesus as well as symbolizing his status as the Christ.



It is often called the symbol that changed history. According to legend, in 274 A.D. a light in the noon-day sky appeared to the Roman Emperor Constantine on the eve of battle, and at the same time he heard the words "In Hoc Signo Vinces" (In this sign you shall conquer). He took this as a sign from God and decided the shape drawn by the light should be an emblem for his military. This emblem became known as Labarum. The shape he saw was of a flaming cross: and "on the top of the whole was fixed a wreath of gold and precious stones. Coincidentally, the labarum was similar to an existing pagan emblem used as a standard by the Roman cavalry. Constantine was the Pontifex Maximus, chief priest of the classical Roman Pagan religion. So it's easy to see why he warmed to the symbol. Constantine's army won the battle and eventually Constantine decreed that Christianity, heretofore a persecuted group within the Roman Empire, would become the official religion of the Empire. Constantine was baptized on his deathbed, thus insuring that he would go immediately to heaven, having no time to commit any sins after baptism.

### The Shooting Star

This perennial wildflower gets its name from the multitude of blooms that emerge on each plant, resembling shooting stars. One of the prettiest of our wildflowers, it can produce up to twelve delicate blossoms per plant, in shades of white to deep pink. It is grown easily from seed and is more or less deer resistant.

### Chicken Noodle Soup

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 chopped onion
- 3 chopped garlic cloves
- 2 sliced carrots
- 2 sliced celery stalks
- 4 thyme sprigs
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 quarts chicken stock
- 1 bay leaf
- 8 ounces noodles
- 2 cups cooked chicken
- salt and pepper to taste
- handful of chopped parsley



### **DIRECTIONS**


Soften 1 chopped onion, 3 chopped garlic cloves, 2 sliced carrots, 2 sliced celery stalks, and 4 thyme sprigs in 2 tablespoons oil. Add 2 quarts chicken stock, and one bay leaf and simmer for 20 minutes. Add 8 ounces noodles and simmer 10 minutes. Add 2 cups cooked chicken and simmer 2 minutes. Add salt and pepper to taste and sprinkle with handful of chopped parsley


- **Rebirths** what traditions, ministries and outreach efforts would you like to see brought back?

### **Episcopal Church Women, Coat Drive**

ECW will meet at **twelve noon (note the time change) on October 10** at the Hiwan Homestead Museum on Meadow Way. We will have a special tour of the museum that will stress the connection between the Homestead and Transfiguration. Among other things we will see the altar that graced the first church, St. Mark's - in- the-Wilderness, named for the New York City church St. Mark's-in-the-Bowery that financed it. The altar was left to molder in the field

(about where the Evergreen Cemetery is now), later rescued by the Bancroft family and used to store their croquet set at their summer cabin, now Bancroft House used by EChO, and finally restored to its original function as the altar in St. Marks. We will also see the exquisite silk banners embroidered by the women of the Mission of the Transfiguration. Please invite your family and friends to join us. The cost is one dollar a person.

The Jefferson County Historical Society voted unanimously and enthusiastically to co-host a tour of historical Evergreen homes sometime in the future. Details must be worked out but we will provide the docents for the tour and also offer a lunch. It should be lots of work -- we will need every available church member including youth the day of the tour-- but it should be a big money maker for ECW.

Our tour of the campus in September was a big success and we have been asked to repeat it for those who couldn't make it this time.

Arwen Berry has agreed to be Outreach Chairman and Stephanie Park to be Spiritual Growth Director for ECW. Heartfelt thanks to both.

Looking ahead, we hope to have the county sheriff speak at our November meeting about areas of need in Jefferson County with which our outreach program might help. In December we will bake Christmas cookies together in Jan Stadlers fabulous caterer's kitchen, and in January we plan a quiet day at St Raphael's.


