'May I introduce myself,' the bell says

Today I am called to tell you the story of how I came to be and my purpose of existence during the last 103 years in your beautiful mountain community

But first, I want to tell. you about the terrible flood of 1896. On July 24, 1896, a cloudburst centered on Oub Crock in Evergreen. and within moments the water flowed into Bear Creek, swept everything in its path, and struck Morrison at 8,00 that night. There resulted the largest flood that this area had ever seen. Sadiy, 27 lives were lost and there way also severe damage from the town of Evergreen to the mouth of Bear Creek. Well, sometime after the flood, folks started talking about needing some sort of community call system, to summon aid

during town emergencies. By this time master by Shelley Black

carpenter and builder Jock Spence had built Camp Neosho (now the Hiwan Homestead Museum), and had converted the old Stewart Hotel, south and west of Bear Creek, into a space suitable for a church and vicar's quarters. In 1899, the old hotel was dedicated as the Mission of the Transfiguration by Episcopal Bishop Spalding, and Canon Charles Winfred Douglas was ordained to the priesthood there.

Now this is where I come in. That same master carpenter, Jock Spence, was hired to build me!...a bell tower...dexigned to support a cast-iron bell to alert the community of any emergencies, celebrations, weddings, funerals and for calls to worship at the Mission of the Transfiguration.

I am known as a "free-standing" bell tower and I am made of large unfinished pine logs, in a tapered construction, with a shingled roof over a cast iron bell. I stand 35 feet tall. My cast iron bell was supplied by Grace Episcopal Church in Georgeold Bell Tower and disassembled deteriorating timbers and rebuilt me so that I could continue to support the ringing of the bell. The restored Bell Tower was dedicated again on Easter Sunday of 1979. This dedication marked 68 years, to the day, of the original dedication in 1911!

And, well, time and weather has done it again, and I am in need of restoration. The Church of the Transfiguration has partnered with Histori/Lorps, a non-profit organization that will carry out the restoration beginning this October.

I just wanted to let you know what all is going on!

town, Colo. The Celtic cross, which sits atop the tower, came from the Church of the Redeemer in New York City. The sign over my gate reads "Mission of the Transfiguration," and is still in place today.

The bell first rang on Easter Day in 1911, and the Bell Tower was blessed and dedicated on that day.

The bell and I continued in do our work, gsarding and notifying the community of important events for over 50 years. It didn't even matter to us when Highway 74 was moved away from Bear Creek so that we were no longer right on the main thoroughfare — we still gladly did our job.

Time and weather took their toll and, in 1978, the United States Army rallied around this

Soup Ministry

Homemade soups in the freezer are available for parishioners and friends that are sick, shut-in or need some TLC. Feel free to give soup to someone you see at church that is hurting, or take soup to someone you are going to visit. The soups are in the freezer on the east wall of the kitchen.

Coconut Corn Salad Recipe

3 tablespoons unsalted butter

5 ears of corn, shucked

fine grain sea salt

3 tablespoons fresh thyme leaves

1 cup / 11/2 oz / 40 g big coconut flakes, well toasted

1 cup / 3 oz / 85 g sliced almonds, well toasted

3 tablespoons chopped red onions

big squeeze of fresh lemon or lime juice

Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the corn, sprinkle with a couple pinches of salt and stir well, you want all the corn to be

coated. Cook for just a minute, until the corn looses its raw edge, stir in half the thyme, and then transfer the corn to a large serving bowl. Just before you're ready to serve, add most of the coconut flakes, most of the almonds, the rest of the thyme, red onions, and citrus juice. Stir well. Taste, season with more salt, to taste, and serve topped with the remaining coconut and almonds (and another jolt of juice if needed!).

ST. MARK'S BUILDING ROOM DESIGNATION

The Entry/Foyer: The re-decoration project of the Entry/Foyer was completed in 2013. All furniture was either purchased or donated specifically for this area and for this furniture arrangement. At some point this year, there will be a decorative topper for the large window, and a replacement area rug. We finally have a beautiful Entry Room for St. Mark's! We ask that no items be dropped off and left on the floor or furniture in this room.

Work Area and Copier Room (for Jerri Avery, COT staff and EDSE teachers and staff): At the time we planned for the new Entry/Foyer décor (2013), we determined that the best place for the copier, and the most convenient work space for Jerri and the teachers of EDSE, would be in the current copier room.

There are some details that need to be changed and improved: 1) The existing (ugly and old) credenza was just moved to the barn. 2) There will be a new credenza with custom legs to replace the one just moved to the barn. 3) Artwork will be installed in the existing recessed niche. 4) Art lighting will be installed. At some point in time we will add

some nice work chairs. We really want to delay any additional changes until after the first phase of St. Raphael's is complete. The current credenza space is to be left empty until the new piece arrives.

Private Offices: There are three private offices in St. Mark's for the following individuals: Fr. Michael, Jerri Avery, and Janet Reznik. The items in these offices are changed only at the discretion of the primary occupant.

<u>**Teacher Resource Room**</u>: At the time EDSE opened for business, COT made the commitment to Janet Reznik stating that this room is to be available to the teachers and the school for any resources they require that cannot be maintained in the classrooms.

Large Meeting Room: This room has several functions: 1) Large gatherings for COT events, 2) Indoor play area, as mandated by State of Colorado Department of Human Resources, and 3) Before and After (School) Care area.

There will be a picture rail added in this room (top of each wall on dark cross molding strip) for display of children's artwork for their graduation day.

Vicar Bud Marsh built and carved the two pews that are to remain in this room. Betsy Ewy painted and donated the large painting to the church. We are keeping all the framed photographs/paintings of our past Vicars, Rectors, and Bishops.

<u>Side Meeting Room</u> (Room off to the side of the large room): This area has 2 large chairs (one white and one red and white striped) and one large red ottoman which were gifted to COT by Betsy Ewy and family. The additional chairs are in there for the purpose of COT small gatherings. The piano in this area is a carved piece which goes with the design statement of the building.

<u>Kitchen:</u> The kitchen is on the schedule to be completed, hopefully, by the beginning of 2015. The beautiful red painted chest goes with the style decor of the room. We have just added a vintage wood table by the red chest. We plan on purchasing, after the St. Raphael's project is complete, rolling carts to stack the existing folding chairs. The existing base sink cabinet will be replaced with a new cabinet. The additional plans for the design of the room is contingent on having a rolling cart for the chairs that are stacked in this space.

Stewart Lounge: This room was designated, in 2005 just after the renovation of the St. Mark's building as a whole, as a small gathering room -- to be decorated in the style of the original period of the building, and named for the original owner of the building, Robert Stewart. The furniture in this room was purchased as a result of a fund-raising campaign within COT. The custom window coverings, area rug, and accessories (including the hand-crochet throw) have been gifted to the church for the purpose of use in this room. Last year COT added custom book shelves that match the wall style and finish of the time period for the building. We plan on adding more shelves directly under the large framed, embroidered, fringed cloth (donated by Betsy Ewy). The plan is to add more custom shelves for books so that we can have a library again -- in this room. The Grandfather Clock was also given to COT by Betsy Ewy.

Upper Floors: The upstairs area has been designated as "Computer Lab Area and an Art Room", and is licensed by the State of Colorado Department of Human Resources for use by the Episcopal Day School of Evergreen.
